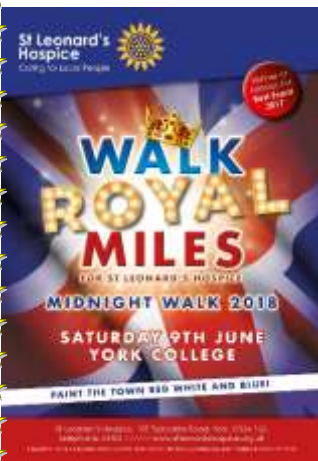
Strensall Library July & August 2018 Events
