The Summer Reading Challenge runs in every Explore York Library

from mid-July to mid-September and last year children read 63,079 books over the summer. There is a different theme each year and in 2017 it helped 3750 children in York keep up their reading skills and build their confidence by reading the books they like. Over 1 in every 5 children aged 5 - 11 in York took part. Children receive small rewards each time they finish a book and a certificate when they complete the Challenge.
