- round any whole number to a required degree of accuracy

Statutory requirements

Pupils should be taught to:

- describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and based on similarities and differences, including micro-organisms, plants and animals
- give reasons for classifying plants and animals based on specific characteristics.

SATs and assessment

KS2 SATs - What you need to know

In the summer term of 2016, children in Year 2 and Year 6 were the first to take the new SATs papers. The new-style SATs for English and maths reflect the new national curriculum, and are more rigorous than previous years' tests.

At the end of Year 6, children sit tests in:

- Spelling, punctuation and grammar
- Reading
- Maths



These tests are both set and marked externally, and the results are used to measure the school's performance (for example, through reporting to Ofsted and published league tables). Your child's marks will be used in conjunction with teacher assessment to give a broader picture of their attainment.

Key Stage Two grammar, punctuation and spelling test

The grammar, punctuation and spelling test (SPAG) consists of two parts:

- A grammar and punctuation paper requiring short answers, lasting 45 minutes
- A spelling test of 20 words, lasting around 30 minutes.

Key Stage Two Reading

The reading test is a single paper with questions based on three passages of text. Your child will have one hour, including reading time, to complete the test. Question types are varied and include multiple choice, short answer and longer answers.



How will KS2 SATs be marked?

The previous **national curriculum levels** have been scrapped, and instead children are given scaled scores.

You will be given your child's raw score (the actual number of marks they get), alongside their scaled score and whether they have reached the expected standard set by the Department for Education ('NS' means that the expected standard was not achieved and 'AS' means the expected standard was achieved).

The range of scaled scores available for each KS2 test is:

- 80 (the lowest scaled score that can be awarded)
- 120 (the highest scaled score)

The expected standard for each test is a scaled score of 100 or more. If a child is awarded a scaled score of 99 or less they won't have achieved the expected standard in the test.

Teacher-assessment results at the end of Year 6

As well as receiving KS2 SATs results, at the end of Y6 you will be told your child's teacher-assessment results for reading, writing, mathematics and science. The teacher-assessment result codes you can expect to see are:

- **GDS:** Working at greater depth within the expected standard
- **EXS:** Working at the expected standard
- **WTS:** Working towards the expected standard
- **B:** The child is working below the expected standard
