

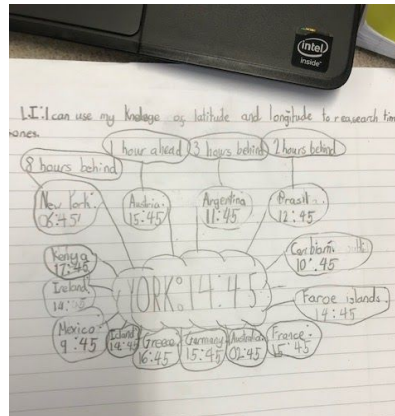
Good afternoon everyone,

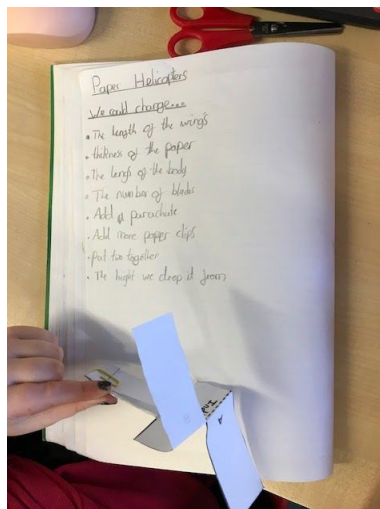
In between, Geography and Science have definitely been the themes!

Last week, I let you know that Year 3 had been ballooning to various locations in the world and that Year 1 had a visit from Jayne Kamintzis on Wednesday - A Scientist in the Arctic.

This week as part of their 'How is Our World Changing' theme, Year 6 have been looking at the globe and how lines of longitude and latitude show position in the world. The boys in the below photograph are pointing them out to us. After this, the challenge was to research time zones and you can see from the written work that there is quite some variance in time depending on where you are in the world. I wonder how many Year 6's began to make the links between the two.



Scientific thinking has been explored around air resistance in Year 5. Pictured are pupils testing out spinners and how long they take to fall to the ground. From this, much discussion has taken place exploring what air resistance is and what changes the children could make to their spinner in order to slow it down. Interesting stuff!
