COMMUNICATION

The partnership between home and school is very important to us and we know that there are times when you need to contact school staff. BEHAVIOUR CHART CHANGES

We are always keen to reflect on our practices and listen to the views of everyone involved in our school. Our restorative practices are understood by all our children and the clarity of expectations ensures that behaviour in school is strong. As part of this process our classroom charts show when children move up the scale to wow or down to wobbly and unacceptable. Our school values and promotes wellbeing and we are aware that this can cause undue anxiety for the children who have moved to wobbly or unacceptable. With this in mind we have made the decision to move the wobbly and unacceptable cards to the teachers desk. This means that they are not on display in the classroom but staff working with the children are aware of those who need support to make some positive choices and move back to good.

When children are placed on unacceptable parents will still be contacted by the classteacher at the end of the day and consequences will be given. Whilst the vast majority of children remain on good, there are a minority of children who may make wrong choices on a more regular basis and this is something we want to address. With this in mind unacceptables will be monitored and if a child has three unacceptables in a half term period we will invite parents to a meeting with members of the school leadership team to discuss how we can support the child to make better choices.
