FILTERING AND MONITORING INTERNET USE IN SCHOOL

We now have a new system in school which enables key people to monitor internet usage in school. Talk Straight has always provided a really robust service for blocking dangerous and inappropriate content and we have always had the ability to alert them to any content we wished to be blocked. The new dashboard now lets us drill down even further so we can monitor individual users, input our own list of keywords we wish to be blocked and will alert us to any concerning content that has been accessed (knowingly or unknowingly).

As Designated Safeguarding Lead, Jo Evans will continue to have overall responsibility for the monitoring of the system.
