Armed Forces Covenant Spouse Development Course

This FREE 10-week, online personal development programme has been designed specifically for spouses, civil or long term partners of serving personnel in the UK Armed Forces. It will allow spouses/partners the opportunity to consider the best way forward for both them and their families, improve their employment opportunities and/or consider their potential in developing their own business.

The course is funded and developed for spouses, civil or long term partners of serving personnel in recognition of the barriers they can face in job, career and business opportunities.

Wraparound childcare changes

The way you register and claim for wraparound childcare is changing from 19 February. There will be a temporary freeze on registrations from 31 January to 19 February. However, if the Service person registers between 19 February and the end of March they'll be able to backdate their registration to 1 February, subject to eligibility.

Little Troopers Therapy Programme

Little Trooper's Therapy Programme in England that supports the mental health and wellbeing of children whose parents serve in the British Armed Forces.

The tri-service Little Troopers Therapy Programme offers free one-to-one psychotherapy sessions in a programme and community therapy groups for older forces children who feel particularly impacted specifically by the challenges that military life can bring, such as having a parent deployed or moving home and school frequently.

There is also an on-demand session available for parents, to help them better support their children at home.
