Sporting Provision at Robert Wilkinson Academy 2023/2024

PE at RWPA has evolved over the years; it is our mission to keep growing this subject even further. We want to provide as many opportunities for our pupils as possible so that they leave RWPA physically literate and have a life-long desire to take part in sport and keep healthy.

PE is offered to pubils in EYFS, right through to Year 6, twice a week. We offer multiple extra-curricular clubs throughout the year, targeting the whole school in a range of activities. As well as having a full time PE coach. we also seek PE provision from external providers within the local community such as the York City Knights rugby club. With so much participation and enthusiasm for sport, we also enter as many competitions as possible, allowing children to take their sporting passion to the next level.

We do this through buying into the York School Sport Partnership Network. In 2019, we were very proud to be awarded the 'Platinum' award from the Sainsbury's School Games Mark and have maintained this high standard for the past five years. This was in recognition of our

hard work, passion and dedication to our subject whilst working hard to obtain the 'Gold' award from 2015-2019.


Swimming is one of the few subjects which can one day save your life. We value it to the extent that we have our own swimming pool on-site. All of our pupils' swim from Y2 right through to Year 6. We have a very high percentage of pupils that leave us water confident by the end of their primary journey and meeting the National Curriculum requirements.

We like to think that our staff have a passion for teaching PE and regular CPD opportunities are readily available and offered to them. We have a full-time sports' coach. Mr Dyson, who delivers PE and promotes the benefits to pupils on a daily basis. Having a full-time coach allows the pupils to benefit from specialist lessons and also for them to share good practice with staff.

We have found that this also gives more pupils the chance to train for and enter competitions. addition to our full-time coach, we have a passionate subject leader, Miss Duffill, who is always seeking new opportunities.




