## **New Families Hub**

Do you and your loved ones know where to find information on Service family life? Our new Families Hub signposts to helpful support, guidance and useful organisations.

For the first time, you and your family members can access a "one stop shop" digital platform – which signposts to a wealth of information, guidance and support – to help you navigate Service family life.

The Families Hub is for all Armed Forces (Regular and Reserve) personnel and families, wherever you are in your Armed Forces journey – from the moment you enter the Forces, through to when you leave.

We recognise the significant role that Service families play in the Armed Forces community, and the unique pressures that can come with Service life, particularly in times of deployment and separation. To address these challenges, there's a wide range of family friendly policies, guidance, and organisations that provide support.

# Information





#### How do we support military families?

We provide online peer support to individuals on a one-to one basis, and group session. We've also created a very caring and non-judgmental online peer support forum exclusively for military families (Dandelion Connect), have teamed up with Reading Force to facilitate an online book club; uniting like minded individuals from our community through a love of books. In addition to this we are collaborating with national organisations like Sands, to bring strategic level support to military families who have experienced bereavement; and working with stakeholders from the military and healthcare sector to raise awareness about the multi-faceted challenges we face, particularly in the perinatal period.
